The explanation for thest ituation is multi-factorial: lackofappropri ateeducationalandtra ining programs, absenceofaform alrecognition of the profess ion by labor and regula to ryauthori ties, lows a laries, poor recognition of theprofessionbycolleague physic ists,insufi cientunderstandi ng ofthehabili tiesand responsibilities of this specialist, a mongothers. In recent year s, there gion has seen an increaseinthecreationofeduca tionalprograms, fromt heBachelortotheDoc torate level, which hashel pedtoall eviatethenum erical shortcoming. However, these academic programs cannot satisfy the requirement of an appropria teclinical training, duetorestr ictionsint hedurationofthe curricularprogram aswell as practical difficulties for an activity which requires a clinical environment. The fewexi sting hospitaltrainingprogram scanhar dlydeal wi ththeneeds. This talkwil lrevie w the situationintheregionandwill focuson theneedsrel atedtothe professional certification.
