Role of the Medical Physicist in State Government

- Membership on a State Advisory Board/Council
 - CRCPD Quick Survey Results:
 - 31 state program directors responded
 - 16 have an advisory council or board
 - 7 additional states create an ad hoc committee, or something similar, when needed

Role of the Medical Physicist in State Government

- Regulatory / Policy Changes
 - Watch for efforts to revise state regulations
 - Always provide comment during open comment period
 - Your supportive comments are important!

Role of the Medical Physicist in State Government

- -CRCPD Working Group Participation
 - Suggest State Regulations
 - National surveys (e.g., NEXT, brain perfusion)
 - White papers and guidance for state personnel

- CRCPD Working Group Participation
 - Advisor must be a CRCPD member
 - Resource Individual represent your professional organization or federal agency
 - Peer Reviewer
